



## APPLICATION TO THE CONCURRENT BS/MSREE DEGREE PROGRAM

Instructions:

- a. Applicants must be BSREE or BSEE students in good standing, with GPA of 3.0 or better, in the year prior to graduation of their undergraduate degree.
  
- b. Email your complete application to the MSREE program director with the subject line “Concurrent BSEE/MSREE” or “Concurrent BSREE/MSREE”. Include your academic advisor and your two faculty references in the cc field. Attachment files are named with your last name and the type of document, i.e. "Smith\_application". Your complete application includes:
  - This cover page. **Fill all fields.** If you do not have other names in your academic records or previous degrees write “n/a” in the corresponding field.
  - Academic plan for the next two years.
  - Personal statement (500 – 750 words) explaining how you meet the admissions requirements of potential for excellence in graduate-level academic work in the field, potential for success in industry, and other information that you feel will support your application.
  - Resume.
  - GRE scores, if you have taken them.
  
- c. Ask your two EERE faculty references to send a brief recommendation over email to the MSREE program director.
