
Integrated Student Health Center Choose Well Campaign

The Integrated Student Health Center (ISHC) has launched a health promotion campaign to encourage students to make healthy choices across a range of behaviors. The "Choose Well" campaign is a two-pronged research-based program, which tracks student behavior change instead of simply raising awareness about issues. Students will notice the 8 foot by 8 foot "Choose Well" tent across campus at a variety of venues this year, which will be providing health promotion information and live giveaways for students.

At each health promotion event, students will be encouraged to select a healthy behavior specific to the event topic that they can implement into their lifestyle (such as doing monthly breast exams for Breast Cancer Awareness, staying hydrated or wearing sunscreen for Safe Spring Break and so on). Research tells us that by stating an intention to engage in a specific healthy behavior, the likelihood that the students will follow through with that behavior is greatly increased. One month later, ISHC will contact those same students via e-mail to see if they actually did engage in their chosen behavior, which adds another layer of accountability to the mix.


The second aspect of the "Choose Well" campaign involves providing promotional items with the "Choose Well" branding to encourage students to make healthy choices. The likelihood that the students will follow through with that behavior of the illnesses treated at ISHC could have been

prevented by engaging in basic personal hygiene activities, in fact, the most frequently requested procedure this past year was wigrow toenail trimmers, tooth brushes, packs of Kleenex, nail files, dental floss, and compact mirrors. These items are distributed at the "Choose Well" tent, as well as at the front desks for both the Residence Hall and the Village apartments on campus.


Through collaborative relationships, The ROCK encourages each student to:



Bank Mobile Refunds

Oregon Tech has contracted BankMobile to assist us with our refunding to students. Examples of refunds are financial aid, refunds due to dropped classes, and housing deposits that were returned by January 15, students to name a few. Refund preferences are set up using the GREEN ENVELOPE from BankMobile, which will be sent to the address we have on file for the student. It arrives about 10 days after students register, and contains a unique personal code. Refunds are processed through direct deposit to an existing account, paper check, or refunded to the Bank Mobile Visa Card (a MasterCard DEBIT card). If students do NOT receive this green envelope, they should contact the Cashier's Office.

WHEN IS MY BILL DUE AND HOW MUCH WILL IT BE?
The Oregon Tech Business/Cashier's Office will post Winter term balances to student accounts as soon as the student registers for Winter term. Registration for Winter term is November 5-16, per the Academic Calendar. The due date to pay this balance is full in January 18, 2019. Balances can be viewed on Web for Student on CASHNet, both of which are accessed through the TECHweb portal.

Winter term classes begin January 7, 2019, and financial aid (including loans, scholarships, grants, etc.) begins disbursing to student accounts Thursday before the term begins on January 3, 2019. Students should complete their financial aid eligibility requirements as early as possible (and preferably before the term starts) to ensure their aid is disbursed prior to the tuition and fee payment deadline. Accounts can be monitored for financial aid disbursements via Web for Student or CASHNet. If it has not disbursed by January 16, students should contact the Financial Aid Office at the Financial Aid Office as it may not be disbursed by January 15, students can visit the Cashier's Office to find out other options regarding their balance due. Students should also make sure to set up their BankMobile

The Oregon Tech women continued to court the field as they finished with nine players in top 10 finishing to the tournament title led by Stephanie Koza who took home medalist honors. The OIT men won the men's tournament by 17 strokes over Northwest Christian at the final round of the Oregon Tech Fall Invite at the Running 'R Ranch Resort.

On the men's side, College of Idaho's Chris Carow held on to win medalist honors. Erickson led the Owls followed by Tyler Franke (4th), [Marvin Tibbs](#) (6th), [Aleksei Kozlov](#) (8th), and [Zack Malins](#) (9th).
